



Downtown San Carlos Laurel Street Water Feature

Located on Laurel Street directly across from Harrington Park, this sculptural water feature is designed as a visual and experiential anchor along the primary axis connecting the park, the street, and the adjacent stage pavilion. At its heart is a striking rock-like sculpture set atop a series of three tiered pools. Water spills from the sculpture, initiating a cascading waterfall that flows through the pools before disappearing into a discreet, flush-mounted grate at ground level.

The water descends an abstracted hillside, animated by intermittent, flower-like "blooms"—small, sparkling jets that offer dynamic visual interest. The tiered pools subtly overflow their edges. Seating brackets the fountain. The benches invite visitors to pause, listen to the soothing sound of water, gather with friends, or capture a memorable photo.

The cascade primarily faces the park and pavilion, creating an open and welcoming presence, while offering a more serene and introspective experience along the adjacent sidewalk.
